

Town of Onalaska
Public Hearing
May 25, 2017

The Town Public Hearing was called to order by Chairman Rolly Bogert at 5:30 pm at the Town of Onalaska Town Hall, N5589 Commerce Road, Onalaska, WI. Board members present were board members: Chairman Rolly Bogert, Stan Hauser, Frank Fogel, and Jerry Monti; Resident David Harter and Mary Rinehart, Clerk.

Notice and purpose of hearing was read by Chairman Bogert. Hearing notice date was April 25, 2017. The clerk read comments received from residents:

Dan Filzen N5444 Eagle Circle Lane, Onalaska, WI: Before he moved to the Town of Onalaska, there were comprehensive plan surveys sent to residents which defined the direction the people wanted to go. He believes comprehensive plan changes are bigger than other meetings and would like to see advertising of these meetings.

Eric Lysaker N5452 Eagle Circle Lane, Onalaska, WI: Wants to know what is happening with development. Bogert explained the comprehensive plan has requirements for review every 10 years. Bogert also explained that the 350 foot easement (to the south and west of the Dynamic development) will remain.

Tammy Clark N5428 Eagle Circle Lane, Onalaska, WI: If there is expanded industrial development, environmental studies should be done first. Being a conservation district is why people moved to the Prairie, Clark stressed.

Gail Filzen N5444 Eagle Circle Lane, Onalaska, WI: Questioned the location of a berm. Also, was concerned how information is communicated to residents. She stated she is concerned, "how things are happening".

Dawn Duellman N5437 Eagle Circle Lane, Onalaska, WI: Express road impact concerns with additional semi traffic, speed consideration, and road width. She would like to see wider roads with bike lanes.

David Harter, W5726 Koss Road, Onalaska: If in favor of the changes in the comprehensive plan. Harter stated he also owns land in the area and purchased the land with the premise of industrial development and is in favor of using it for that purpose.

Dan Duellman N5437 Eagle Circle Lane, Onalaska, WI: Stated, "The recycling stuff is already here, where do we stop?" Duellman would like to see more tourism development.

David Harter, W5726 Koss Road, Onalaska spoke in regards to development he would like to pursue within the development area addressed within the targeted area of the proposed changes.

Motion by Supervisor Hauser; seconded by Supervisor Monti to adjourn. Motion passed unanimously at 6:30 pm.
